


Anderson One Consistently Performs in the Top 15% of all School Districts in Any Academic Measure:

- Many Schools with HVAC, Roof, Electrical, Plumbing Issues
- PVHS Multipurpose Facility





SECURITY

All schools need upgraded/replaced cameras,

access doors, software

- Need secure vestibules:
 - Spearman Elementary,
 - Powdersville Elementary,
 - Hunt Meadows Elementary,
 - West Pelzer Elementary,
 - Wren High School
- Need considerable work to create secure vestibules at Palmetto High and Powdersville Middle Schools




PALMETTO ELEMENTARY **SCHOOL**

Two Aging Middle Schools

Palmetto Middle (1952) - 67 Years Old

Wren Middle (1956) - 63 Years Old

Exceeded their life expectancy – Aging systems include electrical, mechanical/HVAC, plumbing, roof. Safety issues





So How Much Will It Cost?

Million - Project

- 5.7 Safety and Security- All Schools (vestibules, cameras, access doors)
- Replace Palmetto MS and Wren MS
- 21.3 Additions to CGES, PvES, SpES, PvMS, PvHS (and MP Building)
- 5 Renovations to PHS, WHS, Adult Ed.
- 11 Repair/Replace aging HVAC and Roofs

132 Million - TOTAL









So How Will You Pay For It?

- 20 Million from Local Option Sales Tax Over Next 5 Years
- 3 Million from District General Capital Fund
- 109 Million from Bond Referendum
- 132 Million Total









Bond Referendum?

- A referendum allows the district to sell bonds to fund building programs paid back by taxpayers
- To move forward, the voters would have to approve the 109 million dollar bond referendum on April 30, 2019

*How Much Would It Cost Me?

- For a \$100,000 homeowner = \$5.33/month or \$64/year
- For a \$10,000 Vehicle = \$.80/month or \$9.60/year
- For a \$100,000 Business = \$8/month or \$96/year

*Millage increases to 46.
